Dear Mr. Nielsen,

A couple of my members are having a question about the Common Type Rating List. I heart from your colleague Matthias Borgmeier in our recent FCL.008 meeting that you might be the right person to ask.

In case you are the right person, here is my question:

In the German LBA common type rating list the PA-46 Jetprop (PA46-DLX) requires a different type rating than the PA-46-500TP (Malibu Meridian), although it's the same airframe with the same PT6 engine, differences are only minor. Whereas the Piper PA-46-310P (Malibu) and the PA-46-350P (Malibu Mirage) and the PA-46-500TP (Malibu Meridian) with major differences (Piston vs. Turboprop) are under the same type rating = PA46.

As a consequence it is very complicated and expensive for those who want to fly both the Meridian and the Jetprop to maintain these two typeratings. Is thers something that could be done?
